

Santa Suit Dinner Setting

Ingredients

Bisque:

- # 1611 Square Coupe Charger
- # 1610 Square Coupe Dinner Plate
- # 1004 Tuscany Coupe Salad Plate
- # 3044 Rectangular Tray

Color:

- FS-2300 Polar Bear
- FS-2314 Black Lab
- FS-2315 What-A-Yolk
- FS-2392 Rockin' Red
- NTG-9554 Snow Storm

Brushes and other materials:

- # 6550 ColorStix Mop Brush
- # 6603 Ultimate II Round Brush # 8
- # 6605 Ultimate II Round Brush #12
- # 6601 Ultimate II Round Brush #4
- 2 Fun Writer Bottles
- Sponge
- Sgraffito* Tool



Directions

Step 1- Apply 3 generous coats of Rockin' Red to the entire Square Coupe Charger and the Tuscany Coupe Salad Plate using the Mop brush. Put those pieces aside to dry.

Step 2- Using the # 12 Round Brush, apply 3 coats of What-a-Yolk to the side area of the Rectangular Tray where the letters will go and also to the edge of the Square Coupe Dinner Plate going inside the plate about 2 ½ inches where the small ornaments will go. Put that piece aside to dry.

Step 3- Using the # 8 Round Brush, apply 2 coats of Polar Bear to the bottom area of the Rectangular Tray where the Santa/sleigh will go. Put aside to dry.

Step 4- Using the Cricut or cut out the patterns and letters shown in the design. Use the water and paper technique and apply the "Ho Ho Ho Away We Go" to the side of the Rectangular Tray over the What-a-Yolk area and apply the Santa/sleigh or any design you choose to the bottom of the tray over the Polar Bear. Let dry for about 5 min. and apply 2 generous coats of Black Lab with the # 12 Round Brush to the entire tray. Peel off the paper when it is dry to the touch.

Step 5- Apply the paper circles to the edges of the Square Coupe Dinner Plate over the What-a-Yolk. Let dry about 5 min. then apply 2 generous coats of Black Lab to the top side of the plate going to the edge but leaving an edge of What-a-

Yolk as a trim on the edge of the plate. Let dry to the touch then peel off the paper circles. When the plate is completely dry you can apply Polar Bear from a Fun Writer Bottle for the ornament cap. Using a small cleaning tool or a common pin, Sgraffito* the hooks on the ornaments. The back side of this plate is not painted.

Step 6- Trace the Santa suit pattern onto the Rockin' Red Tuscany Coupe Salad Plate. Apply 2 coats of Black Lab to the entire belt using the # 8 Round Brush. Apply one coat of What-a-Yolk to the belt buckle from a Fun Writer Bottle going right over the Black Lab. Shade the edges of the buckle with Black Lab using the # 4 Round Brush.

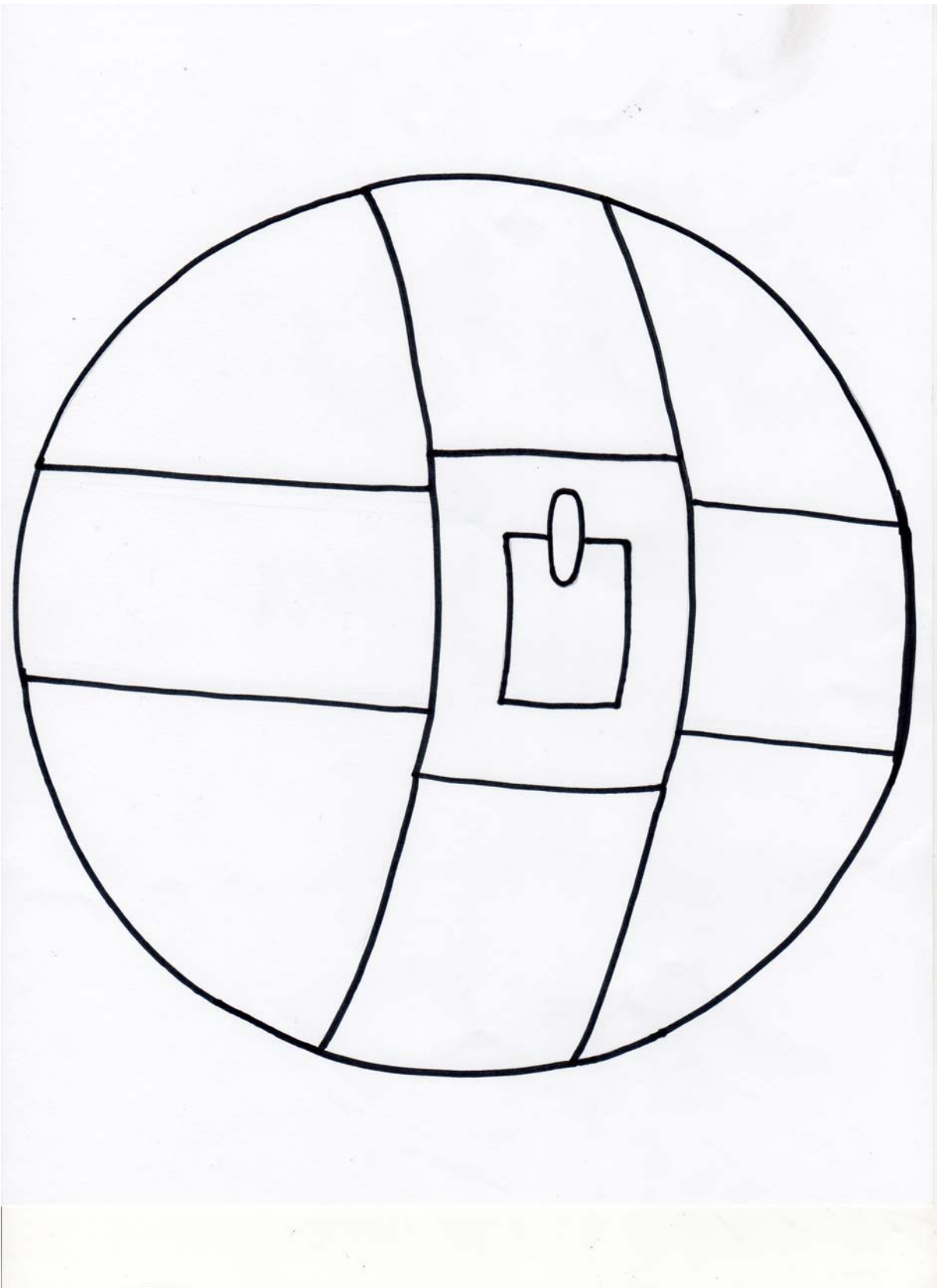
Step 7- Apply 2 heavy coats of Snow Storm to the fur part of the suit.

Step 8- Let all pieces dry and dip into Dazzle Dip Clear Dipping Glaze and fire to cone 06.

*Sgraffito is a technique where a top layer of color is scratched to reveal a colour beneath. The term comes from the Italian word *sgraffire* meaning (literally) "to scratch". The 'wrong end' of a paint brush works well for sgraffito. If you use a knife to do it, you need to be careful not to accidentally scratch too deep and through the underneath color.
