project time -4 hours



INGREDIENTS

BISQUEFIRE

3031 Rim Platter

7070 Small Ornament

7071 Large Ornament

FS- 2373 Key Lime Pie

FS- 2376 Bouncin Berry

FS- 2390 Orange Crush

FS- 2391 Red Blaze

FS- 2390 Pumpkin pie

FUN STROKES

FS- 2300 Polar Bear

FS- 2314 Black Lab

FS- 2324 What a Yolk

FS- 2328 Mocha Chino

FS- 2329 Hi Ho Silver

FS- 2333 Indian Summer

Step 1- Apply 3 to 4 coats of Key Lime Pie to the entire back side and rim of the platter. Wipe down the center with a damp sponge and apply 2 coats of Black to the center inside of the platter. Let the platter dry. Trace Pattern.

Step 2- Apply the following colors to the design on the platter using fun writer bottles. Leave a space between the colors so it shows the black outline. You only need one coat when using the fun writer bottle but with the Polar Bear it is best to apply a second coat after the first coat is dry. Tree: Mocha Chino. Ghosts and moon: Polar Bear. Grass: Leap Frog. Path and clouds near the moon: Hi Ho Silver. Steps: Indian Summer. House: Bouncin Berry. Roof What-a-Yolk. Chimney and roof on the window in the top is Red Blaze. Windows: Polar Bear. Front Door: Mocha Chino.

Step 3- Write "The Boo Crew" with Black Lab using a fun writer bottle.

Pumpkin Ornaments:

Step 1- Sponge 3 coats of Orange Crush to the ornaments. When everything is dry, trace the pattern of the face of your choice to the ornaments.

Step 2- Apply two coats of Indian Summer to the nose. Apply 2 coats of Black Lab to the eyes. Apply coats of Chocolate Moose to the stem area. Shade around the nose with some chocolate moose. Apply a little Indian Summer to the bottom lip area. Apply eyebrows and mouth with Black Lab using a small detail brush or the Fun Writer bottle.

Step 3- Apply Indian Summer for dividing lines on the pumpkin body. When doing the front face area, only apply near the top and the bottom.

Firing Instructions:

When firing dip the platter first. When it's dry, stilt it in the kiln at an angle so that the front of the platter is higher than the back. Now dip each ornament by dipping all but the face area. The face and the top of the ornament shouldn't be clear glazed at this time. You don't need clear glaze inside the of the ornament so avoiding that is easier. Now place the ornaments on the back side of the plate where you want them. Now you can take a soft fan brush and apply some glaze to the areas of the face that hadn't dipped yet. Also apply extra glaze between the ornaments and under them. You don't have to move them to do this. Just drip a little glaze wherever they are touching the tray or each other. Fire to a cone 06 and hope that nothing moves J.....If it is stilted right it won't move.

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
