Instructions for Gare Glaze-by-Number (Read all instructions before you begin)

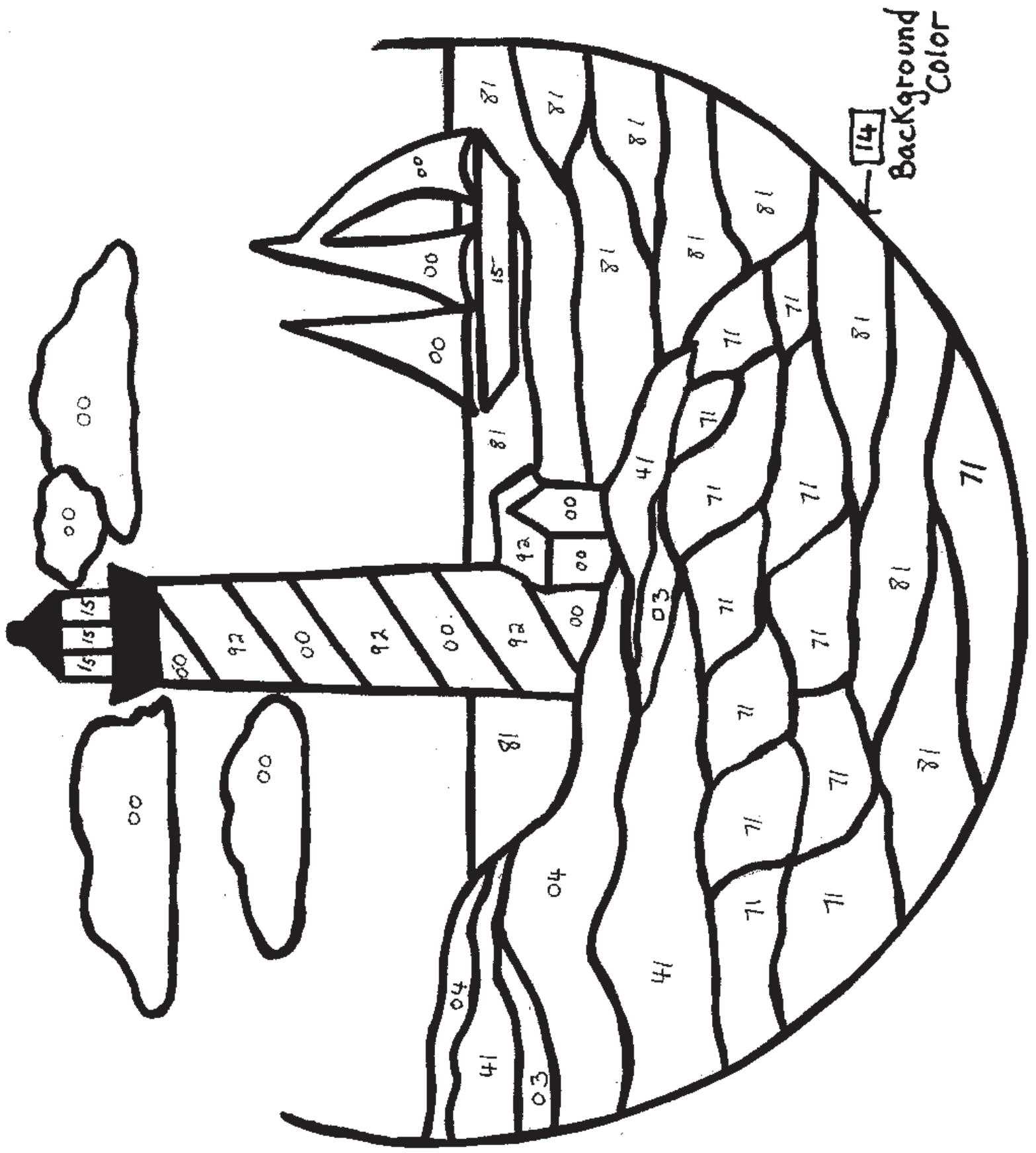
- All numbers are the last two numbers in the 2300 Fun Strokes series unless all 4 numbers are shown. In this case it is Fun Strokes Fleckles that are the 2400 series.
- Base coat color is applied 2 coats if black, 3 coats for light colors over the entire piece. All glaze by number colors are applied over the base coat.
- All glaze-by-number techniques are only 1 - 2 coats if applied with a Fun Writer type bottle for maximum opaque coverage. 2 coats are used if it's a large area to cover. On a vertical piece, use 2 thinner coats to keep it from running when applied.
- When applying color, you will be leaving spaces between each color wherever you would have an outline. If your background is black then your entire outline will be black as shown in photo.
- A number with a square around it indicates a solid background color and all backgrounds are applied with a brush suitable for solid coverage such as a Millennium Brush, Glaze/Mop brush or a very large round brush.
- If the colors blend into one another, they are applied 1 heavy coat and will have an arrow showing the direction and order of the colors.
- When colors are blended into one another or swirled on top of each other, it is done when the color is still very wet.

↔ Means the colors blend horizontally.

↕ Means the colors blend vertically.
