Watercolor Vase

project time -2-hours



INGREDIENTS

BISQUEFIRE

1004 Coup salad Plate

FUN STROKES

FS- 2300 Polar Bear
FS- 2326 Fir Ever Green
FS- 2333 Indian Summer
FS- 2354 Something Blue
FS- 2360 Oliveoyle
FS- 2361 Leap Frog
FS- 2368 Old Yeller
FS- 2375 Jumpin Jelly
FS- 2376 Bouncin Berry

STEP 1- Apply 2 coats of Polar Bear to the top side of the coupe plate. Let dry.

STEP 2- Squeeze out some glaze on a tile (about the size of a quarter) for each of all the colors in the color list except the Polar Bear.

STEP 3- Trace the pattern on the plate and use more as a guide especially for the flowers. Apply each color with water in your brush and don't apply neatly. Apply very free flowing. On the flowers, do all the Blue then the purple then the Berry color. Let them overlap a little. You can go back on each color, just here and there with less water in the brush to give some darker areas so it gives some depth. Apply darker Purple color in the centers of the flowers.

STEP 4- The vase: Apply Oliveoyle first, leaving some missed spaces to show the white underneath. Now apply a little of the Something Blue near the bottom area of the vase. Remember keep all these colors watery. Use a little Leap Frog to darken the left side of the vase. Apply Oliveoyle to the pears also and again use the Leap Frog to add in some darker areas. Use a tiny bit of Indian Summer with very little water so it is a little darker than the other colors and apply to one side of each pear and to the pear stems.

STEP 5- Add a little Old Yeller to the centers of the flowers by just dabbing it in with the back of a brush.

STEP 6- Apply the pear shadows with Something Blue, then water it down a little more and apply very lightly some color around the bottom area going around the pears and the bottom area of the vase as shown in photo.

STEP 7- Dip into clear glaze and fire to a cone 06.
